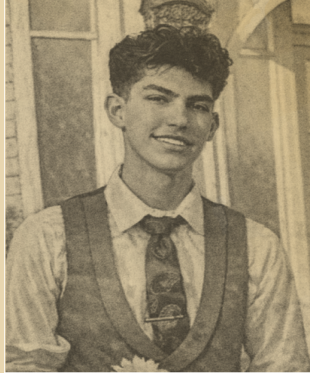


Political Prisoners

A sentence of “Moharebeh” has been issued for **Shervin Bagherian**, an 18-year-old teenager. The ruling was handed down following forced confessions and a fabricated case broadcast by state television. He was denied access to a lawyer and a fair trial, raising serious human rights concerns. Shervin Bagherian now faces the imminent risk of execution.



News of the Day

According to a report published by the Student Scientific Association of Sociology at Tarbiat Modares University, it is claimed that around **50 unidentified bodies of women protesters** from Tehran are still being held at the Kahrizak site. The report, presented as a “field report,” criticizes the reduction of victims to mere statistics and emphasizes the need to identify the victims in order to understand social demands and achieve what it calls “plural unity.” The report states that turning those killed into numbers paves the way for forgetting and erasing them, describing the “unidentified body” as the most important witness that has not yet been reduced to a statistic. In conclusion, the authors call on the public to share any information regarding students who were killed or detained, reports from university committees, and news related to universities. These claims have not been confirmed or denied by official sources, and are published solely as cited from the mentioned source. The referenced location is situated in southern Tehran.

Iran's Immortal Names

Sepehr Afrazeh, a 31-year-old from Isfahan, was shot and killed on January 9, 2023, during the Iranian uprising near Simin intersection. Raised by his mother after losing his father, he held a master's degree in Business Management and worked at a car showroom.



Children Targeted by Bullets

Killing of Children by the Islamic Republic

Taha Houshyar, a 12-year-old child born in 2013 from Boumehenn, Tehran, was killed during the nationwide protests on January 8, 2026, after being shot directly in the face with live ammunition by Islamic Republic security forces. According to reports, he was targeted by direct gunfire at the scene and lost his life.



When the Law Falls Silent

Ali Heidari, a young protester injured and arrested during the January 8 protests in Mashhad, was executed by the Islamic Republic on February 8. His family had no information about his condition until the execution was suddenly announced, underscoring ongoing concerns over human rights violations.



The Story of a Loneliness

Pouria Hamidi, a young man from Bushehr, attempted suicide after publishing a video about the 1404 protests and the killing of protesters by the Islamic Republic. In the video, he addressed the international community and said in Persian, “We, the people of Iran, are very lonely.” He ended his life shortly after releasing this message
